Third Sector Network

Using Technology in Health, Care and Wellbeing for all

On the 14th of June 2023 Medrwn Môn held a Third Sector Network Event about using Technology in health, care and wellbeing.

Digital technologies have advanced rapidly in recent years and are quickly becoming essential within the health care system. Using technology in the home can have the potential not only to facilitate the role of home health care but also to help individuals to stay happier and healthier for longer at home.

The event was designed to generate discussion around the seven main themes of

our Technology in Care Project which are:

- Home Safety
- Home Security
- Personal Safety
- Social Interaction
- Health and Fitness
- Learning
- Mental Health



14 organisations and groups attended, with presentations on each theme being given to highlight much of the good work that is already going on in this field. From the discussions across the 7 themes, we have collated all the information and have identified 3 recurring priorities.

- **Communication and Accessibility**: those attending wanted to know more about what technology is available and who provides it, how people are referred to services and projects and how information is shared so that it reaches the people who need.
- **Training:** here people wanted to know if there was help for people to set up and use the technology, how we could help keep people safe using technology and whether there was any training available
- **Cost:** questions related to funding for the equipment and running costs as well as options for loaning equipment and internet charges

Following the event some participants have joined Ceri Seeley our Digital Support Officer to work as a team to decide how the priorities could be addressed.... Keep an eye on Medrwn Môn's Website and Socials for updates!!!



Those taking part in the day were also given the opportunity to take part in the **Autism Reality Experience**, which provides an eye-opening lesson in the effect autism has on day to day life.



Community Groups help contribute to a Communities Policy for Wales

The Welsh Government is developing a Communities Policy for Wales. To make sure that the policy reflects the whole of Wales, representatives of Welsh Government were invited by the Gwynedd and Anglesey Public Services Board to visit North Wales to get a flavour of what is being done at a community level across the Island. As part of this work, Medrwn Môn invited five community groups and organisations to meet with Welsh Government and Public Service







The visits took place across Anglesey and Gwynedd between the 12th and 14th June and we visited Tyddyn Môn, where we were joined by representatives from Benllech and District Good turn Scheme, Iorwerth Arms (Bryngwran), Seiriol Alliance and Tal Y Sarn Farm (Dwyran).



The visits gave the groups and their service users the opportunity to have open and honest conversations about how important their projects were locally, how they work with others and to show what issues are important to rural Welsh communities. It was also a chance to highlight the strengths are within our communities, what we achieve though working together, and any obstacles and challenges our communities face when developing services. The visits saw a range of discussions from volunteers and staff from all the projects as well as a performance from the Tyddyners!

We've had a great time and enjoyed welcoming everyone to our stand. We would like to say a big thank you to everyone who has supported us this year, two fantastic days full of excitement.



Proving that tech in care works!

The Technology in Care project looks at how different types of technology and apps can be used to support people to manage their own health and wellbeing, and includes smart watches to measure physical activity levels, SMART homes devices (SMART bulbs, thermostat management tools) and also and devices that provide virtual information such as Amazon Alexa and echo devices.



The project offers a trial period of equipment to individuals with no cost over the months agreed.

As well as support with technology in the home GPS trackers are also proving to be very popular, especially for those living with dementia and their families. Many have said the peace of mind it gives them has been invaluable.

Helping to keep people safe with GPS Trackers



Michael is 70 and has recently had a dementia diagnosis. Michael and his wife attend some of the support groups locally, this gives them both some time away from the house and also a chance to chat and have a panad with friends. But as Michael is sometimes confused and forgets place names and locations they decided it was time for some help.

Following a referral from one of the support groups they attend, the couple had a discussion with Ceri Seeley the Digital Support Officer for Medrwn Môn. Ceri was able to support them with decision making on what types of technology might help them around the house and in their communities.

After a long discussion it was decided that they would like to trial the new GPS tracker, this will support the couple over the next few months - and even if its only there for peace of mind they both know that it will help keep Michael safe in his community.

Getting Clwb y Gorlan Online



Cwb y Gorlan in Amlwch have a great space which is a fantastc asset in the community. They want to be able to have more amenities on offer to local people. They had a discussion with one of Medrwn Môn's Local Asset Co-ordinators, Rhian Hughes, who realised they needed some technical support in the building.

Following a referral from Rhian, Ceri Seeley our Digital Support Officer visited the group to see how she could best support them. Ceri was able to determine that the group would benefit from having WiFi installed - which would encourage more groups to use their building.

Ceri installed a MiFi device and a sim card so that those using the building can now access the internet. This will mean being able to offer many other services than before, with the group possibly looking at holding courses, or even film nights in the building.

Combating loneliness using a Samsung tablet



Jackie was referred to Ceri, our Digital Support officer by our Local Asset Coordinator, Rhian. Jackie had discussed with Rhian that she had not been out of her home since before the pandemic, which meant she had missed out on may social events which lead her to become lonely and isolated, and it had also had an affect on her mobility.

After a discussion with Rhian and Ceri, Jackie decided to take a samsung tablet on loan from Medrwn Môn, which would give her access to online social groups and allow her to do her grocery shopping and read the news from her home. It will also give Jackie the opportunity to find out about groups in the community and connect with locals. In time, Jackie will seek to join a local group to gain some much needed confidence and tackle her loneliness

At present there are 5 community transport schemes across Anglesey, and are solely run by volunteers.

Benllech Good Turn Scheme, Seiriol Good Turn Scheme, Môn Community Link, Bryngwran Cymynedol and Ynys Cybi and Valley Good Turn Scheme.

3178 Journeys Volunteers of the good turn schemes use their own vehicle to support people to attend health appointments, shops, and activities. Medrwn Môn has also supported 3 of the schemes, Bryngwran, Seiriol and Ynys Cybi, by securing funding to purchase wheelchair accessible vehicles, enabling more people to use their service.



73 Volunteers

An elderly couple in the village contacted Benllech and District Good Turn Scheme, because they had to give up driving due to health reasons. They came to us for help for them to be able to get to their medical appointments, and to take the gentleman to a falls class weekly. The volunteer driver collects the couple from their home, takes them to their appointment and helps them during the appointment, the driver then waits outside to take them back home and and makes sure they are safely inside their home before leaving.





"We started using the Good Turn Scheme so that we could attend health appointments without worry or discomfort. We appreciate the kind attention and care given by all the drivers".

The Alliances across the Island have been busy, let's have a look



Lligwy Alliance have started work on their community garden in Moelfre, which is located on the grounds of the community hall. The community has been working hard in designing, planning and now building the community garden. Children of Moelfre primary school were asked to give ideas of what they wanted to include and how they wanted the garden to look. The committee took their ideas and drew up plans that are now coming to life with the help of volunteers,



Aethwy Alliance wants to better engage young people in the work that they do. Awen and Anne went along to Ysgol David Hughes to ask the young people for their ideas on how to achieve the Alliance priorities. The information gathered will support the Alliance in moving forward with their choices.

The next Aethwy Alliance meeting will be held on Tuesday 12/09/23 6.30pm at the community centre Penmynydd.



Bro Aberffraw Alliance are working alongside Bangor University, on a coproducing Community Narratives project. This project involves working with residents in the local area to define their community and support them in describing what it looks and feels like to live/work there (through creative methods of art, photography, film). From this, they will have a more holistic, richer, and creative understanding of their community, allowing the Alliance to identify their community priorities.



Crigyll Alliance were tasked with choosing three priorities to work on from the evidence that was collected from the mapping for the area, the themes from the evidence were discussed and those that attended felt that the wider community should have an input into the final decision about which to start with. To move this forward Medrwn Môn created a **survey** for people to decide on the priorities and to get some confirmation from the wider community about whether this is the direction the Alliance should go in.



Bro'r Llynoedd Alliance have recently been busy funding 4 community groups from across the ward. The following groups were successful with their application for funding from the Alliance - Valley Community Group, Bodedern Nursery, Bodedern Juniors Football Club and the LEGO build Church, Bodedern. The Alliance have also been supporting the Valley Community Council make better use of its green spaces - with one or two new projects in the pipeline!







Medrwn Môn's GwirVol Grant has funded several youth projects this year enabling young people to develop skills and gain experience within their local community. Here's a snapshot of what the young people have been up to over the summer......



Llangaffo Play Area





A group of dedicated young people have established their own gardening club at their newly developed local park. They decided to spend the GwirVol Grant on gardening equipment and seeds to grow plants in a raised bed and trellis. They all worked hard to get the area looking pretty and inviting and have even designed their own t-shirts for the club.

The young people also bought sports equipment with the funding and held an activities club for the younger children in the village. The Play Area Group have said 'Brilliant to see the youngsters of the community so willing to volunteer their time. They were excellent, displayed a mature attitude and encouraged the children to have lots of fun!'

Grwp Cymunedol #CaruAmlwch

A group of young people used the funding to create a meaningful seating area in the community's allotments in memory of local volunteers. The young people spent their time painting and decorating the bench in bright colours, hoping to bring a smile to those who have lost loved ones and create a space for everyone to enjoy. The young people were pleased to be involved in a heart felt project that commemorates those who have dedicated their time to the allotments and the local area.

Môn Actif sessions in Hen Fecws

We are so pleased that the children & young people activity group finally went ahead! Sessions were originally arranged pre-Covid but unfortunately had to be postponed.

Thank you to Barry (MônActif) and his team for running the group.

'The 10 weeks of activities in Dwyran have been great and I've had a clear view on community engagement activities as I personally attended the majority of these sessions along with our sports coaches and instructors. It was great to see the numbers building week on week with the highest attendances on the register being 22 which is great, with a minimum of 16-17 participants in attendance each week'

Once the sessions ended the local councillors wanted to provide further activities for the young people of Dwyran, so Cllrs John Ifan Jones and Arfon Wyn have provided outdoor play equipment for the local children to use at the field by the old school, available daily 10am - 7.30pm.






Llanfairpwll Memorial Hall is officially open!

Funding information & advice

Medrwn Môn take the strain out of writing procedures, policies and strategies and provides funding advice and information service for community groups and voluntary organisations, by advising on potential funders and how to apply for funding.

'Isle of 'Anglesey Charitable Association' recently distributed £380,434 to 9 successful applications under their large grant - Medrwn Môn assisted 5 out of the 9 applications which amounted to £207, 100.(55%) of all applications.

The National Lottery Community Fund brings Anglesey communities together

Thanks to National Lottery players, numerous community groups and charities on Anglesey have recently been successful in applying for a grant to strengthen society and improve people's lives.

Two groups in Llanddaniel Fab are celebrating their success - **Gŵyl Mabsant Llanddaniel Fab** will bring people together in a fun day for the whole family on 23 September with their £1,900 grant, whilst **Clwb Gwawr Llanddaniel Fab** were successful in their application for £1,840 to extend their provision and provide regular Welsh language activities for the local community.

Some of the other projects benefitting from a National Lottery grant are:

Bryngwran Cymunedol Ltd - £9,920 to install solar panels and batteries on part of the lorwerth Arms community pub which hosts a space for community events and services.

Llangristiolus and District Club for the Aged - £3,550 to develop outside space that will be used by the whole community for gardening and social events.

Age Cymru Gwynedd a Môn - £100,000 to continue to support people aged over 50 with information and advice to alleviate the negative impacts of the cost-of-living crisis, for example, to access allowances, pension credits and schemes that will help reduce household energy costs. This grant will also help to sustain the range of services they offer and develop programmes of activity.

Digartref Cyf - £50,000 towards development plans to refurbish the Holyhead Enterprise Centre (HEC) as a homeless hub for rural Anglesey. Subject to more funding, the current day centre will move to a newly refurbished building with ample parking, offering additional services to compliment the current provision.

Neuadd Goffa Llanfairpwllgwyngyll officially opened to the public after receiving a £54,150 grant from The National Lottery Community Fund in 2020 towards upgrading, refurbishing and extending the hall. The funding has enabled them to create a space with better facilities for the community, third sector organisations and public services

School Essentials Grant

For Children whose families are on lower incomes and qualify for certain benefits can apply for a grant of:

- £125 per learner
- £200 for learners entering year 7 (to help with increased costs associated with starting secondary school)

All compulsory school years from reception to year 11 are now eligible.

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Learners who receive free school meals due to transitional protection arrangements do not qualify.

Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year. The 2023 to 2024 scheme is now open and will close on 31 May 2024. To apply for this grant please contact your local authority.

Training funds for individuals!

We aim to support individuals from the communities of Anglesey and Gwynedd by means of small grant making in order for them to access training or education which will improve their lives and lead to a job or better career prospects.

Who do we help?

- 1. live in Anglesey or Gwynedd.
- 2. not eligible for support from other local support services.
- 3. Undertake specific training which will improve their chances of employment..

What type of training does the organisation fund?

- Vocational training in any field. An example would be construction related competency cards (CSCS),




