Children In Communities invests £1.5million in Holyhead!

BBC Children in Need, in partnership with City Bridge Foundation, The National Lottery Community Fund and Pears Foundation, has announced the first four locations set to benefit from Communities for Children - a major new funding programme supporting community-led change to reduce the impact of child poverty.

Backed by a £15 million investment, Communities for Children will support ten areas across the UK with high levels of child poverty, providing long-term funding to help local communities design and deliver their own solutions.

By placing power and resources directly in the hands of communities, the programme aims to create lasting change for children and families, addressing local challenges while building the leadership, partnerships and learning needed to influence wider policy and practice.

The first four locations and organisations, each set to receive £1.5 million over five years, are:

- Holyhead, Anglesey (Wales) – Medrwn Môn
- Wishaw, North Lanarkshire (Scotland) – Corra Foundation
- Hackney (London) – Coffee Afrik CIC
- Seacombe, Wallasey (Liverpool City Region) – Right to Succeed

Since 2001, Medrwn Môn has supported communities and voluntary groups across Anglesey to become independent, resilient and resourceful.

Medrwn Môn has helped communities build on their strengths, identify local priorities and work with public services and partners to develop effective working relationships and create lasting change.

Lyndsey Campbell-Williams, Chief Officer from Medrwn Môn says: ***“Communities for Children will help us to build on our relationships in Holyhead, providing the resources and time for us to really invest in long-term solutions to the barriers experienced by our children, young people and their families. Through the programme we will work with our communities to identify the strengths, opportunities and assets that we have available to us and ensure that the voice of our communities is embedded in the changes needed to tackle the inequalities experienced by the people of Holyhead.”***

Child poverty remains one of the UK’s most urgent and entrenched social challenges. The latest figures show that more than 4 million children are growing up in poverty across the UK – over 1 in 4 children (27%).*

While addressing the complex systemic issues which cause child poverty requires action at national and regional levels, Communities for Children recognises that much can be achieved locally. This means working closely with communities to respond to their unique challenges and opportunities in order to drive sustainable change for children and young people. Communities for Children will build strong local partnerships, support community leadership and amplify the voices of children and young people - particularly those who are too often left unheard.

Communities for Children is being rolled out in phases, starting with the first four locations announced today and expanding to ten areas across the UK in 2027.

Medrwn Môn Celebrates Children and Young People’s Wellbeing with a Third Sector Village!

This year, Medrwn Môn brought the Children and Young People Third Sector Wellbeing Village to Anglesey Show, shining a spotlight on just a small part of the incredible work, support and difference being made by Third Sector organisations right across the island.

This year we were joined by:

- **Mind Our Futures** - a programme that aims to put young people in the lead.
- **Sea Watch Foundation** - Caru'r Cefni is a community-focused environmental project.
- **Project Prism** - a youth led project, centering neurodivergent and LGBTQ+ voices.
- **Môn Community Link** - children and young people’s social prescribing project.
- **Hwb Cybi** - the new community hub is coming to Holyhead
- **Red Squirrel Trust** - engages young people through specialised educational outreach
- **Gig Buddies** - pairing people who have a learning disability with volunteers who share similar hobbies
- **Action for Children** - offering advice, information, and activities for children and young people who have caring responsibilities.
- **Public Service Board** - improving joint working across all public services in each local authority area in Wales.



Partnership working to develop a Youth Strategic Plan for Anglesey

Over the last few months we have been working with Anglesey County Council on the new programme from Welsh Government in Youth Work in Wales: Delivering for Young People.

The Welsh Government has introduced a statutory framework for youth work to legally position, plan, and monitor youth services for individuals aged 11 to 25. To make sure that the framework is partnership led and is inclusive of the voice of young people, Medrwn Môn has been asked to Chair the work, that will help to establish a network of statutory and non-statutory providers of youth activities and services on Anglesey.

The work began with face-to-face workshops in June, and a series of mapping and engagement exercises over the summer for us to get a better understanding of the breadth and diversity of activities already happening.

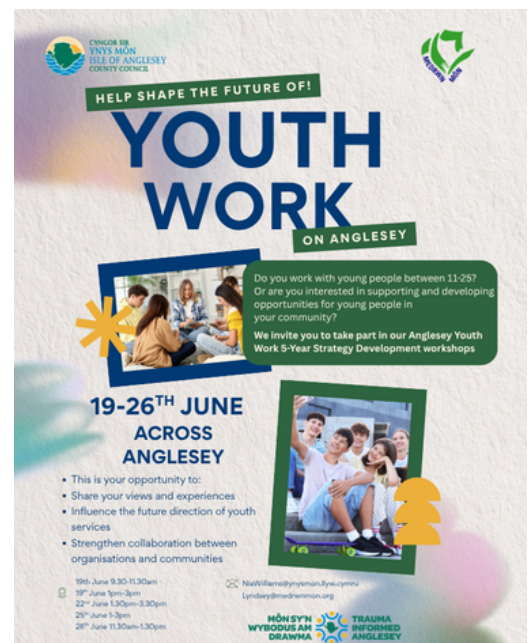
This information has all been collated into a draft plan and an open session was held on the 14th September with local groups and organisations, Anglesey Council and young people to check if the plan reflected everything that we had been told.

The 5 objectives chosen to work on in partnership following the consultation were

- **Improving mental health & wellbeing**
- **Enhance employability, skills & future opportunities**
- **Strengthen participation & youth voice**
- **Improve access, equality & inclusion**
- **Develop a sustainable & collaborative youth work sector**

and the session held on the 14th September looked at how we could collectively take ownerships of the actions needed to reach the outcomes, which partners we needed around the table and how we would measure success!

The final plan will be submitted to the Welsh Government on 30th September, following which the operational group will start to pull all the work together, bringing in the voices of young people along the journey and involving them in measuring the outcomes and feeding back along the way.



Project Prism helps to design Art & Heritage Trail



Over two weeks in June, Medrwn Môn sat down with the Heritage Partnership, the Isle of Anglesey County Council, Holyhead Town Council, Holyhead Alliance and Studio Response to run six creative consultation sessions across Holyhead to design a new Art and Heritage Trail for the Town with the people who live there.

The first sessions were run with Project Prism members and Anna from Studio Response. The Prism Group had been exploring Holyhead's hidden histories for months and worked with Anna during their session to make postcards of the Town. The session started with the young people finding it difficult to express what they valued about the Town and moved to stating that “We didn’t learn local history in school. We now really want to know our history, the only history we know is passed down through word of mouth, snippets we hear.” They talked about watching buildings come down rather than get restored, about piles of rubble becoming part of the landscape, and about murals they personally don't relate to. They wanted the work to really feel like it was something for the people who live in Holyhead.

The second session in the Ucheldre Centre with Dr Karin Koehler of Bangor University, saw the groups trace Holyhead's place in nineteenth-century postal history and literature. The room filled with memories, from a descendant of the man who drove the first mail train, proud enough of it to wear a top hat; a woman born on Kennedy Road in 1938 who had spent her working life in the port; and a trend, among some residents, for getting “born and bred in Holyhead” tattooed on their skin.

Celia Hume then ran a watercolour and batik workshop with two groups from Ucheldre's children's art club, aged six to seventeen, where they talked about Newry Beach and the anchor sculpture as their favourite things about the town. The consultation closed with photographer Llyr Evans, who used instant photography and collage to explore self-portraiture, identity and belonging with those attending.

The Town Council and Holyhead Alliance group considered how the money for the artwork should be spent and voted to the decisions should be made by the community including where the artwork goes, what it looks like, and who gets to produce it. The findings from these sessions are now feeding into the wider Art and Heritage Trail implementation plan, working through routes, murals and signage across the town. Project Prism's young people, along with everyone else who gave us their time this June, will stay part of that conversation as it develops.

Amlwch Port Bike Track

Young people lead on a multi-agency effort to strengthen local assets!

Across Anglesey, a multi-agency partnership led by Tai Môn Housing Services, Môn Actif, North Wales Police and Medrwn Môn have been working together to support and strengthen local communities.

Amlwch Port was identified as an area where additional investment could help enhance opportunities for children, young people and families. The partnership along with Amlwch Town Council asked the children from Amlwch School's Council to help us consult with their peers in their school.

Rather than us deciding on what improvements the young people wanted, members of the Amlwch School Council were invited a site visit alongside partnership leaders and North Wales Police and Crime Commissioner Andy Dunbobbin to see what improvements could be made.

During the visit, the young council members agreed to lead a consultation within their school to gather ideas on how best to improve the park space. Their effort saw over 100 responses from young people and their families.

The feedback received identified three clear priorities:

- **Restoring the Bike Track:** Overhauling and clearing the severely overgrown track.
- **Improving the goal area:** Installing a Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA) featuring an all-weather 3G surface.
- **Tidying up the park:** Cleaning up and refreshing the general park area.

Everything moved very quickly on the highest priority - restoring the bike track in Craig y Don park. Funding was secured and contractors set to work on the neglected bike track. In just over 12 weeks after the initial site meeting, the track was officially reopened by Police and Crime Commissioner Andy Dunbobbin. Children of all age ranges from little 3 year olds on balance bikes to teenagers on their bigger bikes attended the opening, and it was great to see how the older children supported the younger children to enjoy the track too.

The Crime Commissioner was very impressed at how quick the project had taken, and commented how good it was to see the children of the area at the heart of the project and a great example of agencies coming together to deliver a placed based project.

And most importantly the children of Amlwch were very happy, this giving them somewhere safe to ride their bikes.



Community Alliances update



Bro'r Llynnoedd - Members of the Alliance joined Medrwn Môn out and about in their communities to chat with residents and gather information about their areas.

Between the 3rd and the 6th of August the team spent time in the Valley, Caergeiliog and Bodedern areas of the ward. Mapping assets within communities is important, knowing what is available and identify priorities to focus on and move forward where possible, in addressing and developing projects.

Bodowyr - The newly established 'Clwb Ni' Bryn is a success! Children and young people have the opportunity to attend the group, participate in activities, cooking sessions, and make new friends. The young people have set up a committee to lead on selecting and purchasing the equipment, to draft a Code of Conduct and establish the rules of attendance.

The group will also collaborate with 'Clwb Ni' Dwyran, who meet at Hen Fecws weekly.

The community transport scheme in Llanddaniel will continue until March 2027, the residents recently took part in a film about the service and explained how this has benefitted them, some feedback received included comments like '**I've got my independence back**' '**This service has helped my mental health**'

The free workshop brought together the organisations, funding opportunities, resources and practical advice that can help clubs save time, overcome challenges and grow.



Organisations attending include Actif North Wales, StreetGames, Sported, Foundations Framework Wales, Welsh Sports Association, The Outdoor Partnership, Disability Sport Wales, County Voluntary Councils, Local Authority teams, and Sport Wales's Investment Team, where you can discuss the Be Active Wales Fund, A Place for Sport, and Energy Saving Grant funds they manage.



Gemma also had the privilege of delivering a presentation to stakeholders and individuals on effective ways for groups, organisations and voluntary groups to recruit and retain volunteers.

The presentation covered good practice, practical tips and key do's and don'ts when it comes to attracting new volunteers and ensuring existing volunteers feel valued, supported and motivated to stay involved. It was a great opportunity to share useful information and ideas to help organisations build strong, committed and engaged volunteer teams.

- Better condition of heritage assets including fleet and skill

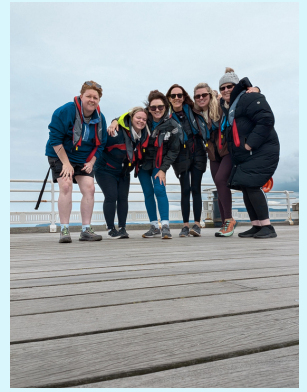

Since setting up the scheme in 2001 Car Linc Môn provides an essential transport service for people who need to go to:

- Hospital appointments
- Visit the doctor, dentist, optician
- Attend a Day Care Centre
- Collect a prescription
- Do some shopping
- Visit relatives or friends who are ill.

Youth Led Grants panel



On the 5th of August, Gemma, our Volunteer Supporting Officer, organised a Youth Led Grant Decision Meeting at our Llangefni office. The meeting brought together six young people to discuss and review applications for funding to support youth-led projects. We started the session with pizzas and refreshments, giving everyone the opportunity to settle in and get to know each other before the decision-making began.



There were 6 applications to go through, and every young person played an important role in the process. Together, they discussed each application, looking at both the positive impacts the projects could have and any potential negative impacts or concerns. They also considered whether the amount of funding requested was suitable and appropriate for each group and their project.

Having six young people involved helped to make the process fair, inclusive and diverse, with everyone bringing their own thoughts, opinions and perspectives to the discussion. Every young person was involved in the decision-making process, ensuring that young people had a genuine voice in deciding how the funding could best support projects that will benefit other young people and their communities.



Following the meeting, there was still some funding remaining. The young people felt that it was important to make the process as fair as possible and give more groups and young people the opportunity to apply for the funding that was left. As a result, the opportunity has been shared again on our social media platforms to encourage further applications and give more youth led projects the chance to benefit some of the grant money.



A huge thank you to the young people who attended and took part in the session. Your ideas, discussions and different perspectives made the session incredibly informative, engaging and amazing. It was fantastic to see everyone working together, listening to each other's opinions and playing such an important role in making decisions that will have a positive impact on other young people and their communities.

We would also like to say a huge thank you to all of the groups and young people who took the time to submit an application. We really appreciate the time, effort and thought that went into each youth led project and application. It was fantastic to see so many positive ideas and projects being put forward.



Although this round of funding is coming to an end, we are pleased to share that another pot of Youth Led Grant funding will be available to apply for next year! We look forward to seeing even more exciting ideas and applications from young people and groups in the future!

Funding Opportunities



The Access Foundation provides grants of £20,000–£50,000 to charities working to tackle the digital divide by making IT facilities, support and learning available to disadvantaged and vulnerable people. Funding is generally for specific projects lasting up to 12 months, rather than general running costs.

The programme is open to registered charities in the UK and a number of other countries. Applications must demonstrate a clear need, identify how many people will benefit and set out measurable quantitative and qualitative outcomes. The Foundation also asks for an itemised project budget, the organisation's latest accounts and safeguarding policy.

The Foundation does not fund CICs, individuals, general running costs or overheads, religious activity, animal charities, political activity or most education institutions. Applications are assessed competitively by the Foundation's trustees, with the strongest focus on projects that directly support people in need and can demonstrate clear impact and value for money. There are no application deadlines, and the Foundation aims to make a decision within 16 weeks.

Grant size: £20,000–£50,000, normally for projects lasting up to 12 months

Who can apply: Registered charities in eligible countries, including the UK

Deadline: Rolling programme; no fixed deadline

Christmas Connections Grants – McCarthy Stone Foundation provides grants of up to £1,000 to help older people who may be isolated or lonely over Christmas. Funding can support meals, trips, care packages, small gifts and befriending activities.

The programme is open to registered charities, constituted community groups and CICs limited by guarantee with an annual income below £250,000. Activities must take place between 1 December and 2 January, with a focus on volunteer-led projects and activities that are free or low cost for participants.

Restrictions: Funding must directly support people aged 65+ and Christmas connection activities. Organisations must have income below £250,000. The Foundation prioritises volunteer-led projects and free or low-cost activities.

Grant size: Up to £1,000

Who can apply: Charities, constituted community groups and CICs limited by guarantee with income under £250,000

Deadline: 25 November

Does your organisation run activities for young people and have ideas to address one or more of the following priorities?

- Tackling the cost-of-living crisis
